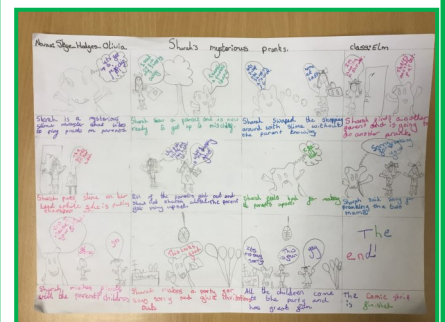
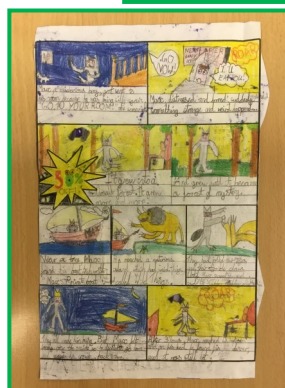
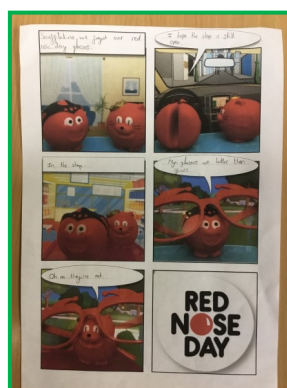

Congratulations to **Year 5** pupils in Birch & Sycamore class this week who came joint **1st with 100%** of pupils reading at least 4 times each week.

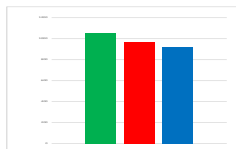

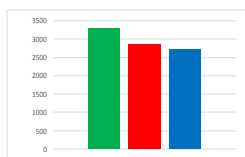
Which house is in the lead so far this term?

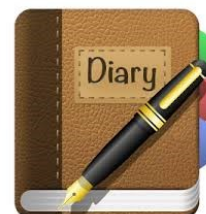
