It is our duty to consistently strive to achieve a goal of 100% attendance for all children. It is also our aim that we support all our pupils so they can continue to attend school even though they may be facing challenging personal circumstances. As a school we reward 100% attendance while challenging and supporting pupils whose attendance could be better.

Please read carefully our new policy which went on our website today and has been updated to meet the new legal requirements for attendance. Please be aware that starting on Monday 27 November, 5 days unauthorised holiday in term-time may result in a fine. If your child is absent from school for 1 week, medical evidence may need to be provided, this could be in the form of a doctors appointment slip or prescription label.

Year 4 Elm - Pupils have thoroughly enjoyed drafting stories of Osiris (God of the Dead).



Reading Challenge:


Congratulations to **Year 4** pupils in **Ash** class this week who came **1st with 93% of pupils** reading at least 4 times each week.
