Dear Parents/Guardians


Year 3 visited We The Curious in Bristol on Wednesday, the pupils said it was the best trip ever because of all the different activities, especially when they made their own rockets.

CLARIFICATION OVER PAYMENTS FOR SCHOOL TRIPS:



School trips are an incredibly important part of school life, and really help children to make the connection between what they are learning inside the classroom, and the wider world. Visits and coach fares are becoming increasingly more expensive every year and so the School subsidises these trips in order to keep costs as low as possible for parents. For example, The £15 Medieval Festival trip is (per child) £7.50 for the day's workshops and £10 for the cost of the coach. The School therefore is subsidising at least £2.50 per child. Although we ask for 'voluntary contributions' it is important to understand that if we do not receive enough parental support we may find it impossible for some trips to proceed.
