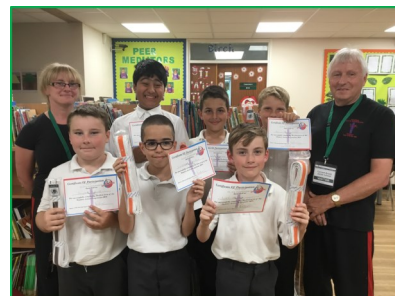
## Headteacher's Message:

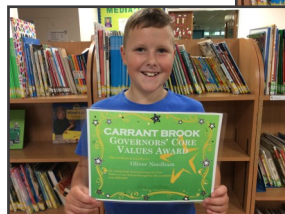
## Commendations:
