Firstly - Well done for surviving the first full week of home learning! Please remember that we are here to help, so please do contact us for support and advice if you need to. Please also remember it is <u>essential</u> that we all follow the Government Lockdown requirements <u>which have now been made Law</u>. A <u>failure to follow these rules may result in your child being unable to use the Keyworker Childcare facility in School due to the safety of both children and staff being compromised.</u>

The Government has now clarified what remote education should look like and this information can be found on the Gov.uk blog using the following link: https://dfemedia.blog.gov.uk/2021/01/08/what-should-remote-education-look-like-how-can-your-child-learn-remotely-if-you-dont-have-a-laptop-we-answer-your-remote-learning-questions/ It states that the length of daily learning should be equivalent to the core teaching they would receive in school. For KS2 pupils (Y3—Y6) this amounts to a minimum of 4 hours per day. These hours include time for direct teaching (either live or recorded) and time for pupils to independently complete set tasks. It is therefore the expectation of the School that the children work the school day with a mixture of live sessions and prepared work via Classdojo.
